01242022-04 Discussion Item Initial Review of the Proposed Budget FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-24

Documents provided to Board prior to meeting: Staff Memorandum; RHCTF-Proposed Budget

Ms. Bortnick presented this item. She noted there is a typo under Memberships. The number should be \$1,350 for both fiscal years for SACRS and International Foundation of Employees Benefits Plan fees rather than \$1,315.

Commissioner Marx raised a question regarding the amount for the City Attorney Work Order. She requested that the City Attorneys' Office break that number down by hours, people, etc.

Tran Ly, City Attorney, said she would ask her finance team for that breakdown.

Commissioner Petrucione asked how the Board is allocating costs between the City's Trust and the City College District Sub-Trust.

Ms. Bortnick replied that the Board has not charged City College District at this point, but that it would be good for the Board to create the charters now for future allocations.

Commissioner Murphy requested clarification on how the sub-trusts' fees are divided and paid.

Ms. Bortnick explained that the sub-trusts are not invoiced and do not pay. All expenses are

paid through RHCTF because there is no general fund money.

Jay Huish, SFERS Executive Director, explained that the purpose of adopting a RHCTF Budget is so the money is in the City and County of San Francisco's budget system. This would allow the City to pay and reimburse City staff members.

Mr. Huish recommended that the Board create a policy in the event of extraordinary circumstances due to a sub-trust's withdrawal. RHCTF could allocate expenses to that sub-trust as a result of the withdrawal.
